Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Minard Community Trust owns and manages Minard Village Hall and the former shop building. In response to the recovery from the impact of Covid-19 restrictions and the lockdowns which tested the resilience of the Community the efforts of the Trust were focused on ensuring the ongoing maintenance of the Village Hall and former shop while they returned to normal public use and ensuring current guidance was being adhered to.

Community events were restarted such as the Community bonfire and fireworks, Beach Clean and Pantomime. We continued to promote local group activity and worked, with many volunteers from the local community, to provide an outdoor seating area at Minard foreshore. We hosted a well attended Jubilee event as the opening for this new facility.

We made successful applications to A'Chruach Community Fund - Windfarm to facilitate the replacement of a bridge and path on a popular walking route in the village. We also made a successful application to replace the Hall shed which was in a bad state. The new shed now provides essential storage for the Trust and various groups who utilise the Hall.

We continue to promote kindness within the Community with ongoing assistance where required to those isolating and isolated. The popular village newsletter with contacts and advice was delivered around the village at Christmas time.

We also hosted two First Aid Courses which were well attended and we have since had very positive feedback on both.

We introduced an online booking facility for the Hall, Shop building and foreshore. This also provides a facility on our website to view events and groups utilising these areas in a "What's on" calendar.

Lastly, we helped to facilitate new groups utilising the Hall including the return of the very popular monthly Coffee Morning and the introduction of a Craft Club.
